It Is God Who Carries Us Each Step

Bel bows down, Nebo stoops low; their idols are borne by beasts of burden. The images that are carried about are burdensome, a burden for the weary. - Isaiah 46:1

The Babylonians and Assyrians used to lug around idols made of metal or wood, heavy burdens that wearied them. Likewise, today humans drag around idols made of false hopes or self or earthly talents or possessions, and these too are a burden for the soul. As God sees us dragging these idols, he patiently reminds us that it is he who has always carried us each step -

You whom I have upheld since your birth, and have carried since you were born. Even to your old age and gray hairs I am he, I am he who will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you. - Isaiah 46:3-4

God made us; and when we walk in his light, he sustains our spirits with his grace and reassures us with truths. So he gently calls us to let go of our idols; for when we set up our human plans and human ambitions, they stand there, unable to give us the answers our spirits need -

They lift it to their shoulders and carry it; they set it up in its place, and there it stands. From that spot it cannot move. Even though someone cries out to it, it cannot answer; it cannot save them from their troubles. - Isaiah 46:7

They cannot save us in times of trouble. Like Babylon's idols, they produce a whirlwind of pointless activity, yet cannot bring lasting meaning or purpose or enduring peace. Yet there is no one like our God; his words are eternal truths, and the purposes of his heart will stand forever -

I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me. I make known the end from the beginning, from ancient times, what is still to come. I say, My purpose will stand. - Isaiah 46:9-10

God knows our ways and he knows we are weak and easily confused, he knows we cannot make ourselves righteous, so he has brought his own righteousness and salvation near in Jesus,

Listen to me, you stubborn-hearted, you who are now far from my righteousness. I am bringing my righteousness near, it is not far away; and my salvation will not be delayed. - Isaiah 46:12-13

All this is from God, who rises to give us the grace we need; all this is from Jesus, who rejoices in being with those who recognize his voice and follow him.
