## A Canopy Of God's Glory

*In that day the Branch of the Lord will be beautiful and glorious, and the fruit of the land will be the pride and glory of the survivors in Israel. Those who are left in Zion, who remain in Jerusalem, will be called holy, all who are recorded among the living in Jerusalem. - Isaiah 4:2-3*

The day has come, for Jesus has come to be our nourishing Branch, to show us God's true glory and his deep compassion in his cross. The day has come, when God gives us the fruit of the Spirit in every season, when in his abundant grace he sanctifies us through and through and calls us his holy people, and when he records our names in his book of life.

It will be a shelter and shade from the heat of the day, and a refuge and hiding place from the storm and rain. - Isaiah 4:5-6*

When we come before the Lord with an open heart, he surrounds us with a canopy of his presence, to give us shade from the heat of the world's withering emptiness. When we are weary and need refuge, our gracious God covers us with a shield of his favor to give us shelter from the world's loud voices and its restless ways.

*The Lord Almighty will be exalted by his justice, and the holy God will be proved holy by his righteous acts. Then sheep will graze as in their own pasture; lambs will feed among the ruins of the rich. - Isaiah 5:16-17*

He is the Lord, and he is exalted by his true justice; for he has brought us all near by the blood of Jesus, so that anyone from any nation may seek him with their hearts and will find him.

God is truly holy, for his ways and his thoughts are far higher than ours. Our God lives in a high and lofty place, yet he has opened the gates to his spiritual pasture, that those who recognize his voice may come in and find spiritual food that satisfies our fainting hearts.

*Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory. - Isaiah 6:1-3*

He is our holy and very great God, who has made the earth full of his glory and his presence and his truth and his understanding, things that we may see when we look above to Jesus, and let him show us things just beyond the world's appearances.
