Let Us Then Approach God

The word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. - Hebrews 4:12-13

God writes his words on the hearts of those who walk in the light of Jesus, and they tell us truths that human minds couldn't have thought of. Nothing about us is hidden from our Heavenly Father; he knows our inmost thoughts and everything we do, to him everything is clear, yet he pours out his mercy and forgiveness and care on those who walk humbly by faith in the Lamb of God - *Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account. Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. - Hebrews 4:13-14*

Italian classical music conductor Arturo Toscanini (1867-1957) was well-known for his remarkable musical memory. Toscanini had memorized each note for each instrument for many dozens of symphonies, concertos, and other musical scores; yet for Arturo, it was not a burden to memorize them, for he enjoyed music and he greatly appreciated the ways that composers could blend their themes with the variety of instruments.

In a much deeper way, our Heavenly Father created each of us, he loves each of us for who we are, and he enjoys being with us. Regardless of what others might think of us, to God each of us is a special symphony, with our own notes and themes. Moreover, God's Son came to live as one of us, and he understands everything we endure - *For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. - Hebrews 4:15*

An example of Toscanini's memory took place once when a clarinetist approached him before a concert, and apologetically said that he couldn't play, since a key on his clarinet wasn't working properly, so he couldn't make one particular note. Arturo asked him to wait, looked at the clarinet, and then thought carefully. When Toscanini finished thinking, he smiled and reassured the clarinetist that he could still play, because his part that evening didn't include that particular note.

Similarly, our Father in heaven knows all of our weaknesses, he knows which 'notes' we can't play; and he reassures us that he himself will protect us from spiritual foes too strong for us, he himself will be with us wherever his path guides us. God calls us to approach him and to draw near with a soft and reverent heart, so he may give us the grace and compassion we need - *Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. - Hebrews 4:16*

And God and his words and the purposes of his heart are the same yesterday, today, and forever.

He Giveth More Grace


He giveth more grace when the burdens grow greater,

Psalm 125 uses this image of the ways our Heavenly Father surrounds us and protects us and guides us. This week, Caleb Dillinger writes about the ways God surrounds us during this world's troubles and fears.

Surrounded in the Fire

There is no doubt in my mind that 2020 will go down in history as a year of challenges for nearly every country, but most certainly a year of challenges for the United States. The pandemic presented challenges to our health, our economy, our education, and our ability to relate and interact with each other. The division between Black and White Americans bubbled forth hate, racism, anger, and violence. Sides became drawn in our presidential election that quite literally left everyone in doubt as to what the state of our country would be in 2021. Last year felt like we were surrounded by fire.

By the grace of our Lord Jesus, we survived 2020 - not all, as there were millions of deaths in our nation by violence and the virus, but we here at Northland survived 2020. How? I'm reminded of an Old Testament story.

Daniel chapter 3 recalls three faithful men in the midst of fire - Hananiah, Azariah, and Mishael (better known by their Babylonian names, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego). I'm sure most of you know this story well. The prideful king sets a statue that demands everyone to bow. The three faithful men won't bow, and are consequently thrown into a fiery furnace turned seven times hotter than its normal levels. The guards who threw the men in actually died from the heat. Then the Bible gives us the beauty of Daniel 3:25 - "I see four men unbound, walking in the midst of the fire, and they are not hurt; and the appearance of the fourth is like a son of the gods."

Whether that fourth figure is Jesus or an angel really doesn't matter - the truth of the story remains: faithful people suffer, but our God surrounds us in the fire. You survived 2020, not because of your great skill or determination, but because our great God surrounded you in the fire of 2020, and our God will continue to surround us in our suffering until the day we are called to spend eternity with him and our suffering ends. Be faithful, brothers and sisters in faith. Our God has surrounded us in the fire.
