From Him And Through Him...

From Him & Through Him & For Him Are All Things

Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God! - Romans 11:33

The depth of God's compassion is beyond human minds to fully fathom, and his wisdom and understanding are too profound for human words to describe. Our Heavenly Father formed each of us with unfailing care, and every one of us is dear to him; truly from him and through him and for him are all things - *For from him and through him and for him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen. - Romans 11:36*

Late in his life, Leo Tolstoy (1828-1910) became disillusioned by this world's futility and its false hopes, and he found hope and peace in the message of Jesus. The more that Tolstoy pondered the nature of God, he was humbled and awed at God's splendor and vastness, as he wrote, "God is that infinite All of which we know ourselves to be a finite part. God alone exists truly."

As Leo continued to learn about Jesus and his life and his teachings, he also saw the care and compassion that God shows us through his Son. As Tolstoy writes, "Love is life. All, everything that I understand, I understand only because I love. Everything is, everything exists, only because of love. Everything is united by it alone. Love is God."

Indeed, God's incomparable love for us all is deeper than we can imagine, his paths are beyond human reasoning to trace out, our Heavenly Father tells us truths that human minds couldn't ever have thought of, and his words comfort our spirits - *How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out! Who has known the mind of the Lord? Or who has been his counselor? - Romans 11:33-34*

As Leo Tolstoy also came to realize the implications of our Father in heaven being the giver of life itself, he said, "Life is everything. Life is God. Everything shifts and moves, and this movement is God. And while there is life, there is delight in the self-awareness of the divinity. To love life is to love God." Truly God gives each of us life and breath and everything else, as the apostle says elsewhere -

For us there is but one God, the Father, from whom all things came and for whom we live; and there is but one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things came and through whom we live. - 1 Corinthians 8:6

The message of Jesus is full of truth and grace and understanding, in him all things hold together, and walking in his light brings lasting hope and peace and spiritual comfort.

Draw every soul to choose the better part.


Thy presence fills the universal space,
