A Peaceful Abode...

A Peaceful Abode That Will Not Be Moved

Your eyes will see the king in his beauty and view a Land that stretches afar. - Isaiah 33:17

We can see our Creator all around us through the wonders he has created, our hearts rejoice in the ways he shows us his care and compassion, and he gives us refuge from this world's storms and harshness, where we can contemplate God's glory and his eternal truths. As we walk in the light of Jesus, we no longer need to fear what this world fears; as we walk by faith, we ponder the many ways our King takes care of us and protects us from spiritual foes that are too strong for us - *In your thoughts you will ponder the former terror* . . . - *Isaiah 33:18*

There is a British saying that goes back at least to the 1500s: "A cat may look at a king". Even those considered lowly were allowed into the monarch's presence and could take a look at their king or queen, and this saying reminded the monarch of this responsibility and the nation of this privilege. Yet, this didn't ask very much of the king, and it also didn't help anyone very much. How much better and truer this is in God's kingdom, where we all may have the gift of knowing our Heavenly Father, where anyone who walks by faith in his Son may have his Spirit live within us, and where our true King welcomes us into his presence, comforts us, guides us by the hand, and tells us truths that human minds couldn't have thought of. God has opened the door to his dwelling place, a peaceful abode where he tells us of eternal things that will never change - Look on Zion, the city of our festivals; your eyes will see Jerusalem, a peaceful abode, a tent that will not be moved. - Isaiah 33:20

In one of Pamela Travers's series of 'Mary Poppins' novels, she uses the old saying about cats and kings in a different way when Mary tells the children the story, "The Cat Who Looked At A King". In the story, a king is so wrapped up in analyzing facts and issuing orders that he has neglected his kind queen and has forgotten about the well-being of his subjects. Then a cat walks in and proposes a contest to the king, each asking the other three questions.

The cat's final question is for the king to name the strongest thing. After the king guesses various powerful animals and forces of nature, the queen gently suggests that it might be patience. At this the king's heart begins to soften, and he realizes that love, patience and kindness are far more important than earthly ambitions and human agendas. How patiently our Heavenly Father reminds us of these things; he is our Mighty One who also carries us gently - There the Lord will be our Mighty One. It will be like a place of broad rivers and streams . . . The Lord is our king; it is he who will save us. - Isaiah 33:21-22

The Lord is our King who saves us, he nourishes our spirits in this world's spiritual deserts with streams of living water, and he remains the same forever.

To Jesus salvation ascribe evermore.



Immanuel, God With Us

Jesus is the Son of God, our Lord and Savior, the Lamb of God; he is also called Immanuel, God with us. This week, Leon Norwood writes about the many things that God's presence and closeness mean to us.

What Immanuel Really Means for Us

In Matthew 1:23 we read "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel (which means God with us)". When you read this verse what things comes to mind? Well, I always think of John 1:14, "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." Here's some food for thought.

Because of Christ's birth, death, and resurrection, we have truly received the gift of "God with us." It is not a passive relationship or ethereal experience. Recall on the night before He died, Jesus promised He would send us an Advocate, the Spirit of Truth, who would come to "live with" us and "be in" us. John 14:16-18. Wow! Imagine the very spirit of God Himself resides not only with us but is in us.

And God with us, as He comes to live inside us, promises to give us strength in place of weakness, hope and courage in place of fear, and light in all those dark places that once occupied our heart and soul. Because of Jesus, Immanuel, we never have to be alone. We never have to wonder how to please God or worry if our efforts fall short. We can simply rest knowing He is with us, in us, loves us, and will never leave us.

When reflecting on God, David wrote in Psalm 139:7-10, "Where can I go from Your Spirit? Where can I flee from Your presence? If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there Your hand will guide me, Your right hand will hold me fast".
