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A Chosen & Precious Cornerstone

As you come to him, the living Stone - rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to him - you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood. - 1 Peter 2:4-5

We have come to Jesus, our living Stone, who cleanses us and builds us up and comforts us and guides us. We have turned to the Son of God, our Lord and Savior, who has made us sons and daughters of our Heavenly Father. We have put our faith and our trust and our hope in the Lamb of God, a chosen and precious cornerstone - *For in Scripture it says: See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame. - 1 Peter 2:6*

Architect Ludwig Mies van der Rohe (1886-1969), whose designs emphasized simplicity, clarity, and structural soundness, said "Architecture starts when you carefully put two bricks together. There it begins." In a much deeper way, our walk with God, our new life, begins when we let Jesus be our cornerstone, and let our Father in heaven build one brick at a time with his care.

Mies also said, "No design is possible until the materials with which you design are completely understood." Similarly, God calls us to understand the nature of his chosen and precious cornerstone Jesus, to acknowledge humbly that he alone is the Way and the truth and the life, and to put our trust in him instead of in human thinking and human abilities. Worldly minds reject the message of Jesus, yet to us he is our salvation and our hope all day long - *Now to you who believe, this stone is precious. But to those who do not believe, The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. - 1 Peter 2:7*

This world builds on faulty foundations, its logic is based on empty reasoning; yet in Jesus we have a sure foundation for all our times. As novelist Charlotte Brontë (best known for "Jane Eyre") writes of her walk with God, "My Maker and yours . . . I rely implicitly on His power, and confide wholly in His goodness: I count the hours till that eventful one arrives which shall restore me to Him, reveal him to me." For Jesus is a trustworthy cornerstone, our Alpha and our Omega.

As she faced this life's trials, Charlotte Brontë wrote of her trust in God, "I try to avoid looking forward or backward, and try to keep looking upward." God has called us out of this world's confusion and darkness and harshness - *But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light . . . once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. - 1 Peter 2:9-10*

There is no one like our Heavenly Father, whose grace flows abundantly to those who walk in the light of Jesus, and it is good to praise him.

A Grain Of Sand


Do you see this grain of sand

Look Forward to The Kingdom of Heaven

Matthew chapter 5, in various sections, takes time to introduce the idea of heaven and prepares our mind to think about this wonderful place called, The Kingdom of Heaven, on a Jesus/spiritual level. While reading these scriptures, God can help us see our connection with the kingdom of heaven.

Jesus helps us to recognize our condition before and after seeing and receiving the light. He says:

For I tell you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the kingdom of heaven. - Matthew 5:20 NIV

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. - Matthew 5:3 NIV

Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. - Matthew 5:10 NIV

Therefore, once we receive Jesus, who is The Light, states:

In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. - Matthew 5:16 NIV

This is why and how we are able together with the Light, can accomplish this and the request of Matthew 5:48, which states:

Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect. - Matthew 5:48 NIV
