## The Promise Comes By Faith

*The promise comes by faith, so that it may be by grace and may be guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring—not only to those who are of the law but also to those who have the faith of Abraham. - Romans 4:16*

Our Heavenly Father's promises come by faith instead of by the law, so that they may be fulfilled for those who believe in the message of Jesus and follow him humbly. God calls Abraham the father of the faithful, for he walked by faith in God and in his promises - *He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed - the God who gives life to the dead and calls into being things that were not. - Romans 4:17*

Jules Verne's 1872 novel "Around The World In 80 Days" opens in a London club, where the members are scoffing at an article that says that it was now possible to travel completely around the world in 80 days. One member, Phileas Fogg, thinks that the writer is right, and he accepts the challenge; he will pay the expenses himself and will pay them a large sum if he doesn't succeed.

Phileas knew that his plans would often need to be modified; yet as Fogg put his trust in modern transportation, we have faith in something much better, in God and in the good news of Jesus. Like Abraham, when we trust in God, he will strengthen our faith as we face this world's trials - *He did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised. - Romans 4:20-21*

Fogg faces many problems, including a British detective who mistakenly thinks that Phileas is a criminal. Yet Fogg calmly adjusts to every change, as he tells his assistant, "Never be in a hurry. You'll miss the best parts in life." When they are behind, Phileas meets and helps Princess Aouda, who in turn helps him arrive in England just in time, as they also become close. Likewise, when we walk in the grace and compassion of Jesus, God continues showing us kindness and mercy - *Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed. - Romans 4:18*

Unfortunately, the detective arrests Fogg before he gets to London; by the time the police realize he is innocent, it is too late, so he has apparently lost everything. Princess Aouda and Phileas are glad they still have one another, and as they go to be married, they realize they forgot that they gained a day by crossing the International Date Line; so they make it in time after all. Similarly, when we trust in God's promises, we can be sure that his path will take us to eternal life - *. . . for us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead. He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification. - Romans 4:24-25*

Our Heavenly Father knows us so well, and he is so gracious to us.

## A New Heart & A New Spirit

*In Ezekiel 36, God tells us that he will give us a new heart and a new spirit when we realize our need for him and turn to him humbly. This week, Karen Susenna writes about God's desire for us to know him closely and the ways God helps us to do this.*

## God My Father

I am learning a lot about God my Father. I am starting to call him "my" Father, rather than "the" Father. He is such a big God! He creates and rescues; he redeems and saves. And, at the same time, he is a close and intimate God. He lovingly formed each of us with his own hands; he is caring and concerned about us; he honors and loves each of us dearly. Isaiah 43 has been showing me the multifaceted sides of our God... of "my" God. Let me show you....

*"He who created you, Jacob, He who formed you, Israel" (verse 1a).*

He is Creator of all things, yet he personally formed you.

*"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine." (verse 1b)*

He offers Redemption to everyone, yet he knows your name and calls you his own.

*"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you" (verse 2)*

He is Savior, yet he personally rescues you.

*"... you are precious and honored in my sight, and because I love you..." (verse 4)*

He loves all creation, yet honors and loves you personally.

*"Do not be afraid, for I am with you" (verse 5)*

He is Protector of all, yet he is very close to you – as close as your breath.

*"everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made." (verse 7)*

This God who uniquely formed us and called us, has given us a Purpose -- to glorify His Name!

It's a very big calling and it's a very personal calling. And, the only way we can accomplish that calling is to know who the Father is. To know how big He is and how personal He is.

When you realize this, it shall become your honor to call him "my Father".
