



Inherited Faith

How do you share your faith with your children or grandchildren?




When they were little: Making church a routine part of their life; reinforcing Bible class by talking about what they did in class; reading story books and watching movies based on Bible stories; knowing and singing their favorite Bible class songs with them at home and in the car; praying with them daily, especially when they were scared or upset; making sure they understand who they are talking to and how special that is.

As they got older: still making going to church important; involving their friends in church as much as possible; still having discussions about what their class was about and relating that to them and people they know; lots and lots of talking! Telling them my feelings/beliefs and asking their thoughts and feelings on anything and everything they bring up; encouraging them to talk to God in good and bad times; sharing my favorite songs with them and explaining why they speak to my heart; listening to and discussing their favorite songs; making sure they have resources (study Bibles, books, people, classes) to explore Gods word on their own.
