Our Steps Are Directed By the Lord

Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails. - Proverbs 19:21

Many are the plans that come from human minds, yet they cannot bring enduring hope or lasting meaning; in contrast, the purposes of the Lord's heart stand forever. Many are the desires of human nature, yet our Heavenly Father's desire is for each of us to be able to come to him with a soft heart so that through his Son he may give us redemption and renewal and enduring hope. How patient God is as he reminds us to hold fast to his words and to fix our eyes on Jesus - *Desire without knowledge is not good—how much more will hasty feet miss the way. - Proverbs 19:2*

In 1841, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow (1807-1882) wrote the poem "Excelsior" (which means 'higher' in Latin); it starts with a determined person pursuing his intention: "Through an Alpine village passed a youth, who bore, 'mid snow and ice, a banner with the strange device, Excelsior." As night falls, this man turns down all offers of hospitality and rejects every warning, replying each time, 'Excelsior'. Yet the next morning, this unfortunate man is found frozen in the snow.

Similarly, this world's thinking and human ambitions miss the way. Instead, God asks us to walk humbly and reverently in the light of his Son, and he will guide us along paths that lead to eternal life - *The fear of the Lord leads to life; then one rests content, untouched by trouble. - Proverbs 19:23*

Later, chess player and puzzle author Sam Loyd (1841-1911) composed a chess problem that he titled "Excelsior", giving the theme a new meaning. Sam's problem starts with a complicated position, and there is only one way to attain checkmate in 5 moves. Towards one side of the board, seemingly distant from the main activity, there is a lowly pawn, apparently a mere bystander.

This pawn moves first, simply to help another piece. Next, the pawn moves to prevent an opposing capture of an important piece. Then the pawn again moves, this time just to clear the way for stronger pieces. Eventually, this pawn unexpectedly makes it all the way across the board, is promoted to a queen, and checkmates the opposing king.

In a similar way, God's ways truly lead far higher than earthly minds can imagine, so he calls us to let him direct our steps instead of following this world's false hopes and distractions; our Heavenly Father asks us simply to stay close with him, to trust in him and care for one another - *A person's steps are directed by the Lord. How then can anyone understand their own way? - Proverbs 20:24*

We know too little to find our own way, yet our Father in heaven guides us and upholds us and protects us, and he pours out care and grace on us when we walk by faith in the message of Jesus.

A Sure Foundation For All Our Times

Whether we are in times of hope or fear, joy or sorrow, peace or confusion, God and the message of Jesus are always a sure foundation. This week, Donna Smith writes about the comfort, shelter, and other spiritual blessings that we get from the Lord, the Rock eternal.

The Rock

Some of the passages in scripture I find most comforting are those containing the phrase "fear not". I remember telling my son and daughter, when they were younger and afraid to attempt a new feat, "There's nothing to be afraid of. I will be nearby." I also remember advising them if a problem were to arise they could always call me. They were confident I'd come to their aid. Likewise, whenever I read a scripture wherein the Father says, "fear not", I am reassured of His presence and confident He hears if I call out to Him. He is the unshakable foundation and rock in this uncertain world. God is far more capable and dependable than even the most loving and giving mother. Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord, the Lord, is the Rock eternal. Isaiah 26:4

The years have passed. My son and daughter are now young adults. The feats they attempt today are quite different now than they were back then. The world they live in and even their relationships are far more complex and often uncertain. I'm no longer nearby or always able to offer assistance.
