We Know Whom We Have Believed

He has saved us and called us to a holy life . . . - 2 Timothy 1:9

Jesus has come to save those who believe in his message and walk humbly by faith in him, he has sanctified us and has given us the Spirit of God to live within us, and he has called us to live a holy life. He does all this because of his unfailing compassion and God's desire to pour out his grace on those who seek him with our hearts - . . . not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace. - 2 Timothy 1:9

Emperor penguins (the largest penguins; they can be as much as 3 feet tall) endure severe winters they as they raise their young. They breed and give birth during the Antarctic winter, when temperatures can be as low as 40 degrees below zero. In summers, they live on pack ice near the sea; so as winter begins, they travel 50 miles or more inland where the mother produces an egg.

The penguin mother then transfers the egg to the father, a process that takes considerable patience and care, so that the egg won't touch the frozen ground. By now, the mother's food reserves are completely depleted, so she goes back to the open sea where she feeds for several weeks. The emperor penguin father carefully balances the egg on the top of his feet, and surrounds it with warm skin and feathers for a couple months.

The Antarctic winter winds can be over 100 mph, so the fathers gather in groups and remain as motionless as possible until the egg hatches. The penguin mothers then return and take over for the fathers, who by now haven't eaten for over 3 months. As penguin parents put all this care and sacrifice into caring for their young even before they are born, our Heavenly Father had planned long before we were born to give us overflowing grace and compassion through Jesus - This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. - 2 Timothy 1:9-10

As the new penguins grow, their parents take turns to return to the sea, to replenish their strength and energy, and to bring food for their young. Meanwhile, the parents also take turns protecting their young from the severe winds and temperatures by forming huddles where the young are kept warm in the middle. Finally, when the young penguins are ready for their adult lives, their parents escort them to the sea.

Similarly, when we put our faith in our Heavenly Father, he guides us, and he guards our spirits as we face the strong winds of this world's futile ways and the chill of this world's harshness and noise. For we know whom we have believed, and his message and his words are trustworthy - *I know whom I have believed, and am convinced that he is able to guard what I have entrusted to him until that day.* - 2 *Timothy 1:12*
