This world can wear us down with its loudness and harshness; it can make us feel like outcasts with its empty promises and its false hopes. Yet our Heavenly Father renews inwardly day-by-day those who walk humbly in the light of Jesus, he heals the spiritual wounds this world cannot heal, and he rebuilds the ruins in our souls - *This is what the Lord says: I will restore the fortunes of Jacob's tents* . . . the city will be rebuilt on her ruins. - Jeremiah 30:18

As 1781 began, in the northern colonies the colonists were making steady progress in their efforts to obtain independence, but in the southern colonies things weren't going well. So George Washington sent two of his generals south to try to turn things around. One of these generals, Daniel Morgan, went to the Carolinas where they had suffered some discouraging defeats. So Morgan began by talking with the soldiers and their officers.

Daniel found that their previous general's plans had been disorganized, overburdening or misusing some units, while not making use of the others. So Morgan devised a different strategy for the next battle. Instead of forming a rigid front line, Daniel arranged them into several lines, and told each line to advance, fire twice, then retreat. This showed Morgan's soldiers that he knew they all were ready and able to help, without putting undue pressure on any of them.

Similarly, God knows that each of us can help the body of Jesus, and he considers each part of the body indispensable. Our Heavenly Father calls us to encourage one another with the message of Jesus, and to see one another as his own sons and daughters. He is our God, our Creator, and Jesus has made us part of God's own family - So you will be my people, and I will be your God. - Jeremiah 30:22

Daniel Morgan also learned that their previous general had watched the battles from a distance; and when things didn't go well, he had simply left without leaving instructions. So the next time they met the opposing forces, Daniel took a place in line alongside the others, letting them know that he would be a part of whatever happened. (The overall plan also surprised the opposing commander; the colonists won decisively at Cowpens that January, starting a series of successes.)

Likewise, Jesus has done this for us in a much deeper way, for our Savior and Redeemer and Lord lived among us as one of us, he endured our sorrows and pains, and he laid down his life for us - Their leader will be one of their own; their ruler will arise from among them. - Jeremiah 30:21

Truly, the Lamb of God is worthy of praise and honor and glory.

Treasures In Heaven

In Matthew 6, Jesus tells us of treasures in heaven, and he calls us to set our hearts on these things. This week, Don Milnor writes about the differences between God and this world's idols.

Worship God . . . Not the Many Idols Out There

Back in centuries past, and still today in some locations, there are people who bow down and worship physical objects of wood, stone and metal. To most of us 21st century people, that probably sounds crazy. Isaiah describes this:

Those who fashion a graven image are all of them futile, and their precious things are of no profit; even their own witnesses fail to see or know, so that they will be put to shame . . . No one recalls, nor is there knowledge or understanding to say, "I have burned half of it in the fire and also have baked bread over its coals. I roast meat and eat it. Then I make the rest of it into an abomination, I fall down before a block of wood!" -Isaiah 44:9, 44:19

We may think, "How silly are these people, who bow down before these manmade things!" But we're not much different. Satan has adapted, and we often do the same thing they did: bowing down to the idols of pride, approval, materialism, pleasure, power, worldly security and comfort, peace at any price, sometimes even oneself...and more.

When it comes down to it, any time we choose to put our faith, hope and trust in anything other than God, we're doing the same thing. I believe that, for most of us, fighting idolatry will be a lifelong task. But we must continually seek to put God above all else. Some passages to consider:

"Thus says the Lord, the King of Israel and his Redeemer, the Lord of hosts: 'I am the first and I am the last, And there is no God besides Me.'" -Isaiah 44:6

Therefore, prepare your minds for action, keep sober in spirit, fix your hope completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. -1 Peter 1:13

"You shall have no other gods before Me." -Exodus 20:3

If we put our faith in this one true God, will our earthly needs be met? God's word addresses this:

Do not worry then, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear for clothing?' For the Gentiles eagerly seek all these things; for your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. -Matthew 6:31-33

More importantly, our spiritual needs will be met, the only needs which really matter:

"But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. -Matthew 6:20-21
