God Will Be Our Guide...

God Will Be Our Guide To The End

As we have heard, so we have seen in the city of the Lord Almighty . . . God makes her secure forever. - Psalm 48:8

The Scriptures tells us of the care God gave in the past for those who put their faith in him; and in our lives we see the ways he takes care of each of us, helps us through the rough times, rejoices with us when we rejoice, and consoles us through sad times. God's love and care endure forever - Within your temple, O God, we meditate on your unfailing love. - Psalm 48:9

Swedish poet Lina Sandell (1832-1903, full name Karolina Wilhelmina Sandell Berg; she married when she was 35) suffered from illnesses that left her partially paralyzed in her childhood, forcing her to remain in bed most of the time. She spent most of her time reading and learning, much of it reading Scriptures and learning about the message of Jesus.

Though physicians had lost hope for her recovery, at 12 Sandell began improving dramatically. As Lina's condition improved, she began writing poetry, and she had her first collection of poems published when she was 16. As she later wrote, "Day by day and with each passing moment, strength I find to meet my trials here; trusting in my Father's wise bestowment." Like Sandell, we too can trust God to sustain us as we face both the good and the bad in this world - *Like your name, O God, your praise reaches to the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with righteousness.*- *Psalm 48:10*

Sandell was close with her parents; when she was 26, her father passed away unexpectedly. She prayed often about her sorrow, drew even closer with God, and continued writing. Her poems became very popular in her late twenties, which also led to many of them being set to music as hymns. Lina writes in one of her poems that became a hymn, "He whose heart is kind beyond all measure gives unto each day what he deems best . . . mingling toil with peace and rest."

Truly our Heavenly Father is a tower of truth and understanding, a citadel of grace and compassion and mercy - Walk about Zion, go around her, count her towers. . . view her citadels. - Psalm 48:12-13

Lina Sandell writes, "Help me in every tribulation so to trust Thy promises, O Lord, that I lose not faith's sweet consolation offered me within Thy holy Word. Help me, Lord, when toil and trouble meeting, ever to take, as from a father's hand, one by one, the days, the moments fleeting, till I reach the promised land." For God will always be our caring guide - For this God is our God for ever and ever; he will be our guide even to the end. - Psalm 48:14

Our Heavenly Father will be our guide even to the end, and his paths are good for our souls.

Treasures In Heaven

In Matthew 6, Jesus tells us of treasures in heaven, and he calls us to set our hearts on these things. This week, Caleb Dillinger writes about the treasure of being together in eternity with the many others who have walked by faith in the message of Jesus.

The Treasure of Faithful Brothers and Sisters

This summer the auditorium Sunday Morning Bible class finished studying 1 Thessalonians. Of the many themes in that small letter, one prominent theme is the significance of spiritual relationships among the church. But Paul doesn't just speak the value of faith-based relationships on earth - he attests to the resurrection of all the saints during the second coming of Christ!

For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. Therefore encourage one another with these words. - 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18

Paul encourages the church to encourage one another with the teaching that the dead in Christ will rise and we who are left will meet them and always be with the Lord! When we talk about treasures in heaven, we know it's not about money or materialism. But the Bible does point to the treasure of relationships!

Think of the faithful people in your life, including those who have passed before you. Parents, siblings, cousins, neighbors, church members, close friends - all who are faithful will be part of that "treasure stored up in heaven".

We sing a hymn called "When We All Get Together". It says, "When we all get to heaven, what a day of rejoicing that will be!" It's not just rejoicing in salvation and eternal life (though that's certainly worthy of rejoicing!), it includes rejoicing in those relationships with all the saints. Keep the faith, brothers and sisters, and whether Jesus comes back in your life on earth, or later, rest assured the return of Jesus will signal the joining of spiritual treasures in heaven: God's faithful people.
