David sang to the Lord the words of this song when the Lord delivered him from the hand of all his enemies . . . He said: The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer. . . He is my stronghold, my refuge and my savior. - 2 Samuel 22:1-3

The Lord is our Rock of truth and mercy and understanding; our Heavenly Father is our refuge from this world's confusion and ruthlessness. God is near with us all, he hears us whenever we call on him humbly, and he has saved us from the accuser's snares and this world's empty ways - I called to the Lord . . . and have been saved from my enemies. - 2 Samuel 22:4

The Sally Lightfoot crab gets its name from its agility and acrobatic feats. These small creatures (about 3-5 inches) live on seaside rocks and lava flows along the Pacific coast of Mexico, Central America, and South America; they are surrounded by dangers, so God protects them in numerous ways. When they are young, they are dark brown, gray, and black, giving them ideal camouflage. Similarly, our Heavenly Father protects us from dangers he knows we couldn't face.

When Sally Lightfoot crabs are full-grown, they become a mixture of bright orange, blue, yellow, and red (their scientific name is grapsus grapsus; a couple similar species are sometimes called Sally Lightfoots). Adult Sally Lightfoots are easy to spot, vet they are so quick and so resourceful that when healthy, they are very difficult to catch, either by predators or humans. Likewise, God also equips us to meet the spiritual foes we face, and he reaches from on high to protect us - He reached down from on high and took hold of me; he drew me out of deep waters. He rescued me. . . from my foes, who were too strong for me. - 2 Samuel 22:17-18

The Sally Lightfoot crab's strong legs have pointed tips, ideal for footing on rocks and lava beds, allowing them to jump or to move quickly in any direction, and also enabling them to withstand the frequent buffeting of waves. Likewise, when we put our faith in God, he enables us to withstand this world's distractions and harshness; he strengthens us inwardly and helps us stand - It is God who arms me with strength and keeps my way secure. He makes my feet like the feet of a deer; he causes me to stand on the heights. - 2 Samuel 22:33-34

Sally Lightfoot crabs are so light and quick that they can even scurry across open water for short distances. Also, if they lose a leg, they can regenerate it. Similarly, God provides us with many resources as we walk by faith in Jesus; and when we stay close with him, he teaches us his ways - As for God, his way is perfect . . . For who is God besides the Lord? And who is the Rock except our God? - 2 Samuel 22:31-32

The Lord alone is God; truly, there is no other Rock besides him.

A Ready & Willing Vessel

Therefore, if anyone cleanses himself from what is dishonorable, he will be a vessel for honorable use, set apart as holy, useful to the master of the house, ready for every good work. - 2 Timothy 2:21

I heard a song recently with a lyric that really struck me. It said "the church can be full of members, but empty of conversions." The song went on to describe what it looks like when a church is brimming with bodies, but missing eager and receptive hearts.

This struck me, because it got me thinking of the state of my own heart. Am I merely a body in a pew? Or am I a ready and willing vessel, filled with the Spirit and looking to carry out God's Will for me in the work of His church?

It can be so easy to feel satisfied by our ability to get to church on time every Sunday (... admittedly, our family is not usually checking off that box!), our long list of children's events we've coordinated or volunteered for, or the number of prayer meetings and conferences we've attended. I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. - Galatians 2:20

I pray that you'll join me as I examine the state of my heart, asking where I can better live out God's Word in order to point the world to Him. Let's focus on storing up our treasures in Heaven, and making every part of our lives just a road sign to direct the way for others walking the road to eternity in Heaven as well.
