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# The Promised Eternal Inheritance

When Christ came as high priest of the good things that are now already here, he went through the greater and more perfect tabernacle. - Hebrews 9:11

Jesus has come, and he has brought many good things that we couldn't ever have attained by human effort or human thinking. The Lamb of God has entered the Most Holy Place so that we could have the good things of salvation and redemption and the hope of eternal life, and he poured out his lifeblood so that God's grace may flow abundantly to those who walk in the light of Jesus - He did not enter by means of the blood of goats and calves; but he entered the Most Holy Place once for all by his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. - Hebrews 9:12

Welsh poet Ann Griffiths (1776-1805; some of her poems have become hymns in Welsh) wrote many poems that reflect her gratitude and appreciation of what Jesus has done for us, and for the blessings we receive as a result of his ministry. In one of her poems, Griffiths writes "Gazing deep into the wonders wrought of old on Calvary, God the Invisible, beholding, Him who lives, yet once was slain, clasped in close eternal union and communion I'll remain."

Truly, on Calvary Jesus did wonders of grace and understanding, and he brings a new covenant to those who believe his message and humbly remain in him. As Ann also wrote, "Let me drink for ever deeply of salvation's flood." For Jesus brings us the promise of an eternal inheritance with him and with our Heavenly Father - Christ is the mediator of a new covenant, that those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance. - Hebrews 9:15

Griffiths also often expresses her wonder and awe of God and what he has done to give us the chance to know him and be with him. In one poem, Ann writes, "Lord God, from whose deep counsels salvation had its birth, Thou only art the ruler of all in heaven and earth; in face of tribulation, whatever may betide, let Thy strong grace assist me beneath Thy hand to hide." The Lord alone is God, from him come life and salvation, and the Son of God has redeemed us - For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made with human hands . . . he entered heaven itself, now to appear for us in God's presence. - Hebrews 9:24

Ann Griffiths also said, "Behold Him all-sufficient, my soul, thy need to fill; take heart, and cast upon him the weight of every ill . . . in thy weakness He truly feels for thee." For as we endure the ills of this world, God is always there to comfort us and carry us through them. Jesus came to bear our burdens and our sorrows and our transgressions - He has appeared once for all . . . to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself. - Hebrews 9:26

Jesus brings us an imperishable inheritance, and his message gives us hope all day long.

# One Sacrifice For Sins

By one sacrifice for all time, Jesus has made it possible for everyone to come to God with a humble heart and receive forgiveness of all our sins, an eternal home with God, and much more. This week, Dot Duncan writes about the grace God shows us in declaring us righteous when we put our trust in him and in the message of Jesus.

# **The Lord Our Righteousness**

For the past 2 months I've been studying the names of God. The one that really caught my attention is *Jehovah Tsidkenu*. Jehovah/Yahweh, is God's personal name and the Hebrew word "Tsidkenu" which means righteousness. These two words combined means," *The Lord Our Righteousness*".

As I meditated on The Lord Our Righteousness a question came to mind, "Why would God call us righteous though we are not?" I found my answer in Jeremiah 23 and 2 Corinthians 5. Throughout the Old Testament we see the Israelites committing sin after sin - murder, stealing, enslaving their brothers, serving idols, presenting blind and lame animals to God as sacrifices, etc. They refused to obey the Living God!

In Jeremiah 23:1-6. – The leaders of Israel had led the people astray and God was angry with the leaders and people. We will focus on verse 6. *Jeremiah 23:6- In His days Judah will be saved and Israel shall dwell safely; and this is His name by which He shall be called, "The Lord Our Righteousness" Jehovah Tsidkenu.* (Amplified Bible)

You see, the nations of Judah and Israel could not make themselves righteous, for they had done evil in God's sight. However, because of the Israelites relationship to God, He called them, *His Righteousness*. He made them righteous! God allowed a sinful people to be called by His personal name, "The Lord Our Righteousness" Jehovah Tsidkenu.

In the same way, we were unrighteous, under the curse of sin but because God loves us, He made us His righteousness through Jesus Christ. Read 2 Corinthians 5:21, For our sake He made Christ [virtually] to be sin Who knew no sin, so that in and through Him we might become [endued with, viewed as being in, and examples of] The Righteousness of God (Jehovah Tsidkenu) [what we ought to be, approved and acceptable and in right relationship with Him, by His goodness]. (Amplified Bible)

May I ask you a question, "how many people do you think would remain friends with you after you had done or said something politically incorrect?" Not very many!

Yet we have a righteous God who is without sin, who is willing to forgive our sin and allow us to wear His personal name, *The Righteousness of God*. My respond to such good news is, "Wow, what an awesome God we serve!"
