Let Us Worship And Adore Him

This season we remember that Jesus broke into this world to bring life and love to His people. As we sing hymns such as "Let Us Worship and Adore Him", let's look to Isaiah 6 for an example of worship and adoration.

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him were seraphim and they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. (Isaiah 6:1-4).

Isaiah was consumed by the greatness, power and holiness of the Lord. The Lord filled the temple, and when the seraphim started worshiping, the temple shook and was filled with smoke. And, as Isaiah sees the true greatness of the Lord, he recognizes, in comparison, his own unworthiness.

"Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the Lord Almighty." (Isaiah 6:5)

He doesn't run from the Lord, which might be a natural human reaction. He stays in the Lord's presence. He is honest and confesses his sin.

Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for." (Isaiah 6:6-7)

The Lord knows that Isaiah, like the rest of us, has a sin problem -- a problem none of us can take care of on our own. Once Isaiah recognizes his sin, the Lord, via the seraphim, take away the guilt of the sin, as well as the sin itself.

The Lord then asks, "Whom shall I send?". Isaiah immediately replies, "Here am I. Send me!" (Isaiah 6:8)

What a beautiful picture of worship. Recognizing the greatness of the Lord, recognizing and confessing our sin, and in freedom surrendering our will to His call in my life. And, that call is anything and everything that communicates His life and love to the world. And, as we walk in His call, we return again to worship and the cycle continues.

In the New Year may we have our hearts open to Come Worship and Adore Him.

Great News That Causes Great Joy

Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem . . . He went there to register with Mary . . . While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born. - Luke 2:4-6

As Mary and Joseph anticipate the birth of Mary's son, first they must travel to Bethlehem just to comply with an imperial edict, and then no one has a room for them after the taxing journey. Yet it is in these circumstances that Jesus, the Lamb of God, is born - She gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them. - Luke 2:7

Writer Edmund H. Sears is best remembered for writing the words to the hymn "It Came Upon A (or The) Midnight Clear". Sears had originally hoped to pursue a career of ministry, yet a series of incapacitating illnesses forced him to change plans, so he devoted himself to writing about the Scriptures and the message of Jesus.

When Edmund wrote the poem that would become the well-known hymn, he was discouraged by the events of the times and was anxious about the future, yet he found both consolation and hope in thinking about the Son of God coming to live among us. Sears's poem begins, "It came upon the midnight clear, That glorious song of old, From angels bending near the earth, To touch their harps of gold, Peace on the earth, good will to men, From Heaven's all gracious king."

The message of Jesus is truly glorious, full of grace and truth; and as Jesus rests in a place meant to be used by animals, so also an angel brings the good news first to some lowly shepherds - There were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them . . . the angel said to them, Do not be afraid. I bring you great news that will cause great joy for all people. - Luke 2:8-10

Edmund also took note that the times when Jesus was born were also full of fear and sorrow, and he was comforted by knowing that the good news of Jesus was true in every era and in every nation, as he writes, "Still through the cloven skies they come With peaceful wings unfurled, And still their heavenly music floats O'er all the weary world."

Jesus did even more than proclaiming peace and good will; he is our Savior and Lord, who brings redemption and overflowing grace to those who open their hearts and minds to his message -

Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. - Luke 2:11

Our Savior has been born, he is Jesus the Messiah, our light in this world's gloom and confusion; and he has prepared a place for us in God's heavenly city.
