In Christ The Fullness Of The Deity Lives

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February 25, 2024 Volume 33, Number 8 In Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form. - Colossians 2:9

Jesus was in very nature God, and he came from heaven full of grace and truth. In Jesus is the radiance of God's glory, and he is the Word made flesh and blood as one of us. The Lamb of God came to bring us the fullness of redemption and salvation -

And in Christ you have been brought to fullness. - Colossians 2:10

French paleontologist and philosopher Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955) was also known for his writings about the message of Jesus. When he was young, Teilhard was particularly interested in studying philosophy and mathematics; then, when he was about 18, he began seriously studying the Scriptures. As Pierre often said, "We are not human beings having a spiritual experience. We are spiritual beings having a human experience."

So, as Teilhard continued learning about both science and Jesus' good news, he realized, as he writes, "What I cry out for, like every being, with my whole life and all my earthly passion, is something very different from an equal to cherish: it is a God to adore." Truly God alone can satisfy the longings of our souls; and when we turn to Jesus, he frees us from the hold of the accuser, he gives us new life, and he gives us his Spirit to live within us -

Your whole self ruled by the flesh was put off when you were circumcised by Christ. - Colossians 2:11

In Jesus the fullness of the Deity lived, yet he poured out his lifeblood on the cross to redeem us. As Pierre writes, "Christianity is pledged to the Cross and dominated by the sign of the Cross. It cannot remain its own self except by identifying itself ever more intensely with the essence of the Cross." For when we trust in the message of Jesus instead of relying on worldly thinking or human efforts, our Heavenly Father makes us alive, and his grace flows freely to us -

God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, having canceled the charge of our legal indebtedness . . . nailing it to the cross. - Colossians 2:13-14

Moreover, the Son of God has overcome death, as Pierre Teilhard de Chardin writes - "Christ has conquered death, not only by suppressing its evil effects, but by reversing its sting. By virtue of Christ's rising again, nothing any longer kills inevitably, but everything is capable of becoming the blessed touch of the divine hands, the blessed influence of the will of God upon our lives." For Jesus has raised us from the grave of spiritual death, and he gives us eternal life -

You were also raised with him through your faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead. - Colossians 2:12

In Jesus we can see God's understanding and compassion, and it is good to praise and glorify him.

Bread That Comes From Heaven

The Old Testament tells us how God fed the Israelites in the desert with manna from heaven, and the New Testament teaches us that Jesus came down from heaven to bring us the bread of life. This week, Tara Neiswonger writes about Jesus' generosity and eagerness in nourishing us spiritually.

Nourishment For The Soul

Grandma baked bread on Saturdays. If you timed your visit just right, you stepped into the house as the bread came out of the white oven, the unmistakable fresh bread smell permeating the little kitchen. Sit yourself at the wooden table and soon you would be sharing a steaming hot bun slathered in melting butter. Offered to you with unselfish love and shared with joy and kindness.

"I am the bread of life", Jesus states in John 6:35, the first of seven "I Am" statements made by him and recorded in John. The path of this statement winds its way thru 40 years of desert wandering. The Israelites, one month out of Egypt, grumble to Moses, asking why did you lead us out into this wasteland to die, what are we to eat? In answer to this, the Lord provided manna each morning, nourishment for their bodies and a sign that God, the God of Israel, was the true God. God fed his people for the next 40 years, right up to the border to Canaan, the promised land. It was not the desert or their own gifts and talents that fed them those long years, but God alone.

"Remember how the Lord your God led you all the way in the desert these 40 years, to humble you and to test you in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commandments. He humbled you, causing you to hunger and then feeding you with manna, which neither you or your fathers had known, to teach you that man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord." (Deuteronomy 8:2-3)

We find ourselves in the New Testament now. The tempter, again in the desert, comes to Jesus, fasting for 40 days and nights. Satan points to stones, saying prove you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread. Jesus answers by way of Deuteronomy 8:3 . . . "man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." (Matthew 4:4)

The soul hungers for nourishment. This is the bread Jesus offers. A path to our God through his Son Jesus. A reliance on this living Bread, as the Israelites in the desert relied on daily manna, feeds and nourished our soul. It is the acknowledgment of dependence on this gift from God that grows our faith and builds our strong relationship with him. A relationship built on our trust in him and given by His grace extended to us.
