June 15, 2025 Volume 34, Number 24 Today is set aside in our country as Father's Day. A day to be thankful to fathers for their love and care. There are many kinds of fathers and yet we who believe in Jesus, all have only one great Heavenly Father. It is from Him that we learn how He intended fathers to be.

In the Old Testament God was known by the names Jehovah, Adonai, or Elohim, but seldom by the name Father. On the occasions when He is known as Father it is in reference to his promise to Abraham and to his descendants, "Sing to God, a father to the fatherless, a defender of widows" (Psalm 68:4-5). In Ps. 2:7 God called himself "Father" in reference to the coming Messiah, "He said to me, 'You are my Son, today I have become your Father," also quoted by Paul in Acts 13:33-34, as he directly refers to Jesus' resurrection. So, when God raised Jesus from the grave He proclaimed that Jesus was his son and He was his father. Jesus, the son of the Father is the gateway to God. This close relationship and title of Father, having the relationship to the Son or Word, changed the O.T. perception of God as an unapproachable divine being to a loving caring, approachable Father.

The great blessing and gift is that anyone who believes in Jesus and is born again by the new birth can call God "Father" (Romans 8).

We can learn everything of what it means to be a father from God. In his model prayer, and in other scriptures, Jesus says that:

A father provides for his wife and children

A father protects his wife and children

A father is to be of good repute and fair

A father is to set a good example to his children and not antagonize them

A father encourages and disciplines his children

A father loves his family and is willing to lay down his life for them

These are the characteristics of God, and he teaches men to strive to acquire the same. Jesus and the apostles echo these behaviors and attributes, in almost every page of the New Testament. It is incumbent on God's children to love each other, John 13:34-35; 1 John 4:19-21, because we are all family.

We mortal fathers are human and fallible, but God is perfect. Let us be grateful for our Heavenly Father for his love, gift of eternal life, and all "good and perfect gifts" James 1:17.

A couple dozen of her poems have been set to music as hymns. She was often called by her middle name, and some of her writings appear under the name of Rosalthe Carey.

The Lord Our God Is Near Us

Now, Israel, hear the decrees and laws I am about to teach you. - Deuteronomy 4:1

God began teaching us well before we came to know him, and he continues patiently teaching us his boundless truths. The Lord has promised us a new land where we may be with him forever, and he calls us to open our minds and hearts to his words and the message of Jesus:

Follow them so that you may live and may go in and take possession of the land the Lord, the God of your ancestors, is giving you. - Deuteronomy 4:1

Red foxes usually have 4-6 pups at a time; and after giving birth, the mother needs some rest. The mother fox stays in the den nursing the pups and giving them affection, while the father collects food and brings it to the den for the family. The father also spends a lot of time playing with the pups, which strengthens their muscles. Likewise, our Father in heaven has always been near us, showing all of us his care, whether or not we realized it. Truly, what could be as comforting and reassuring that God is always near us and that he hears us when we call on him in truth:

What other nation is so great as to have their gods near them the way the Lord our God is near us whenever we pray to him? - Deuteronomy 4:7

When red fox pups are about three months old, the father starts carefully teaching them how to find food for themselves. Instead of bringing food to the den, the father will first leave food just outside. Next, the father fox begins hiding food, teaching them how to look for it. Similarly, our Heavenly Father teaches us one step at a time. He knows how easily distracted we can be, and he continually reminds us of his teachings, for to him we will always be his children:

Only be careful, and watch yourselves closely so that you do not forget . . . Teach them to your children and to their children after them. - Deuteronomy 4:9

Tamarins are a family of small primates that live in South America. The golden lion tamarin (max. body length 10 inches, named for its bright reddish mane) is notable for the way both parents work closely to raise their young. Two or three tamarins are born at once, and after spending their first few days close to their mother, the father begins introducing them to their surroundings.

The father golden lion tamarin carries them on his back most of the day, while taking them one at a time to their mother when they are ready to be nursed. After several weeks, the father begins teaching them to eat solid food, starting with bananas. The father shows how to peel them, and he mashes them for the young. Likewise, our Heavenly Father continually teaches us about his covenant, and reminds us about the eternal land he has promised us:

He declared to you his covenant . . . the Lord directed me at that time to teach you the decrees and laws you are to follow in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to possess. - Deuteronomy 4:13-14

God will be near us, and he will guide us each step.
