Who has wrapped up the waters in a cloak? Who has established all the ends of the earth? - Proverbs 30:4

British physicist and electrical engineer John Ambrose Fleming (1849-1945) is best known for inventing the vacuum tube and for designing the first transatlantic radio transmitter; and he also frequently wrote and spoke about Jesus' message of salvation. Fleming saw both in God's creations and in the Scriptures a depth of understanding and splendor that surpasses human abilities, as he writes, "There is a marked correspondence between the intelligence which lies behind Nature and that which lies behind the Bible . . . linking them together as proceeding from the same source."

The God who gives life and breath also sent his Son to proclaim the good news of redemption and salvation. John writes about the Old and New Testaments: "The broad lines of thought in each of these portions intersect and culminate in the record of one Unique Personality, that of Jesus of Nazareth, and all parts of it are symmetrically related to Him as the Alpha and Omega of it all."

We know who gives life to every living thing; and we know the name of his Son Jesus, who came down from heaven to be our Savior:

What is his name, and what is the name of his son? Surely you know! - Proverbs 30:4

Moreover, the Scriptures are not mere facts, for they teach us about the deepest needs of our souls. And God considers us his own sons and daughters when we put our faith in Jesus. As Fleming wrote, "So it is with the Bible . . . Regard it as a whole. Look at its marvelous vitality, at the spirit which illuminates its pages, at the light it sheds on human nature and human destiny."

John saw how the Scriptures teach us about God's hope for each of us to seek him, so that we could have the priceless blessing of knowing God personally. As John Fleming says, "We find our gaze fascinated by a Divine Radiance which shines from its pages, and our ears by a Divine Voice which speaks to us in words, giving hope in sorrow, forgiveness in sin, and making known the promise and conditions of eternal life." The words of God are full of grace and truth:

Every word of God is flawless; he is a shield to those who take refuge in him. - Proverbs 30:5

God is our refuge from this world's loudness and confusion, and he gives us enduring hope.

Like A Mustard Seed

In Matthew 13 and Mark 4, Jesus compares God's kingdom with a small mustard seed, for God can take the smallest of beginnings, nurture it, and make it grow. This week, Peggy Kaiser writes about the way God can nurture and strengthen our "mustard seed" of faith when we trust in him.

He Enables Me To Stand Strong

I have been nursing Achilles tendonitis for the past few months. It causes the Achilles tendon (part of the ankle) to swell and cause pain. I really enjoy walking, but walking aggravates the tendon.
