August 10, 2025 Volume 34, Number 32 They asked Pilate to have him executed. When they had carried out all that was written about him, they took him down from the cross and laid him in a tomb. - Acts 13:28-29

As the prophets had foretold, Jesus shed his lifeblood on the cross to redeem us; and after his body was put in a tomb, he rose from the grave:

But God raised him from the dead. - Acts 13:30

British writer Robert Robinson (1735-1790) wrote several books about the Scriptures and about religious history, as well as the words to a number of hymns. When he was young, his father passed away, so his family sent him to London to learn a trade. Yet there he began to go carousing with a group of delinquents. One day, a few of them went to heckle someone who was scheduled to talk about Jesus. As the speaker talked, Robinson instead began listening to the message, and soon he decided to follow the Lamb of God.

He is best known today for writing the hymn "Come, Thou Fount Of Every Blessing", and in it he writes about his appreciation of Jesus, "Jesus sought me when a stranger, wandering from the fold of God; He, to rescue me from danger, interposed his precious blood." Robert had realized that the message of Jesus was for him too. Likewise, the good news of Jesus is for all of us, everywhere and in every era, for all those who believe in him and humbly follow him:

We tell you the good news: What God promised our ancestors he has fulfilled for us. - Acts 13:32

Soon, Robinson realized the wealth of blessings that our Heavenly Father gives those who put our faith in Jesus. As his hymn begins, "Come, thou fount of every blessing, tune my heart to sing Thy grace; streams of mercy, never ceasing, call for songs of loudest praise." Truly, God pours out a stream of his holy and sure blessings on those who follow Jesus humbly:

God raised him from the dead so that he will never be subject to decay. As God has said,

I will give you the holy and sure blessings promised to David. - Acts 13:34

Sometimes Robert became discouraged, and sometimes struggled with his old ways, so he put his trust in God every moment. As he writes, "O to grace how great a debtor, daily I'm constrained to be. Let Thy goodness, like a fetter, bind my wandering heart to Thee." For when we drift or stumble, God promises that when we walk in the light of Jesus, he purifies us from every sin:

Through Jesus the forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you. Through him everyone who believes is set free from every sin. - Acts 13:38-39

Who are we, mere dust and clay, that God pours out all these priceless blessings on us.

No One But Christ Jesus

No one but Christ Jesus, who descended from heaven, ever had such power over oneself and one's own nature, from its origins so subject to the sins of carnal desire . . . The humanity in Christ Jesus, therefore, filled in for all the deficiencies of all human beings. Because this humanity is maximum, it embraces the whole potentiality of the species and thus is such equality of being with each human being that it is united with . . .

Minimum things coincide with maximum, as for example, maximum humiliation with exaltation; the most shameful death of a virtuous human being with the most glorious life, and so on. And all these are revealed to us in the life, passion, and crucifixion of Christ . . .

Since we previously showed that Christ died a most cruel death for us, we should now add that it was not fitting for human nature to be led to immortality's triumph by any other way than through victory over death. Christ underwent death in order so that human nature might rise again with him to everlasting life.

German mathematician and astronomer Nicholas of Cusa (birth name Nikolaus Krebs; he is known in history by his hometown Kues, which in Latin is "Cusa") wrote numerous books about the Scriptures and the message of Jesus. He often used mathematical and scientific examples in his writings about God.

Like A Mustard Seed

In Matthew 13 and Mark 4, Jesus compares God's kingdom with a small mustard seed, for God can take the smallest of beginnings, nurture it, and make it grow. This week, Tara Neiswonger writes about the ways God can take our "mustard seed" of faith and help it grow into a strong foundation.

As A Seed Can Grow, Our Faith Can Grow

He replied, "if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mulberry tree, 'be uprooted and planted by the sea,' and it will obey you." - Luke 17:6

The metaphor of the mustard seed and tree speaks to the power of faith.

Luke 11:9-10 reads "So I say to you ask and it will be given to you, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks, the door will be opened." The source of that power is Jesus, a belief and faith in him. As Hebrews 11:6 reads "and without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him."

Diving a bit deeper into the seed metaphor, as a seed can grow cannot our faith grow? What actions can I take to strengthen my own faith? Romans 10:17 reads "Consequently, faith comes for hearing the message and the message is heard through the word of Christ." Immersing myself in the study of the word, hearing, reading, studying builds a strong faith foundation.

Hebrews 12:2 reads "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." Fully understanding the root and core of my faith is Jesus builds a strong faith foundation.

Mark 11:22-24 tells us "Have faith in God," Jesus answered. "I tell you the truth, if anyone says to this mountain, Go throw yourself into the sea and does not doubt in his heart but believes that what he says will happen, it will be done for him. Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer believed that you have received it, and it will be yours." A prayer life builds a stronger faith foundation.
