We Saw His Star

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea . . . Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him. - Matthew 2:1-2

God knew these seekers' thoughts, and in his grace he showed them a star to guide them. Likewise, each of us once began our walk of faith by seeking God, hoping to know him better. When the Magi ask for guidance, they learn that the Savior, our heavenly Shepherd, was born in Bethlehem:

This is what the prophet has written:

... You, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least . . .
for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel. - Matthew 2:5-6

One of the oldest Christmas hymns sung today is "The First Noel", which describes the responses of some of the first persons who went to see the newborn Jesus long ago. The hymn itself has been sung for centuries, for it has its origins in Cornwall (in southwest England) in the 13th century (or perhaps even earlier). The names of the believers who wrote the words and the music were lost to history long ago, and over the years the words have occasionally been revised.

The hymn opens, "The first Noel the angel did say was to certain poor shepherds in fields as they lay . . .", and later says "They looked up and saw a star shining in the east . . . and to the earth it gave great light, and so it continued both day and night . . ." God showed this great light both to the Magi and to the shepherds to guide them. Similarly, whenever we too seek God, whether for guidance or understanding or mercy, he will light the path for us with a "star" that we can see and understand with the eyes of our hearts, so that we may know that God is near:

They went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. - Matthew 2:9-10

Today the word "Noel" means Christmas day or a Christmas carol. It comes from a word in Old French that also meant "birth", a fitting word for the coming of our Immanuel, who gives us rebirth in this life as well as the promise of eternal life. For as the hymn says in a later verse, "Then let us all with one accord sing praises to our heavenly Lord; that hath made heaven and earth of naught, and with His blood mankind hath bought." It is good to praise and honor and worship Jesus, our Lord and our Savior and much more:

They saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. - Matthew 2:11

We may not have any of these gifts, yet God asks us to give him the gift of our hearts and minds.
